



Collection vs Potential of National Zakat (trillion)






Collection of Zakat is still 3,5% from its potency.





The integration of national zakat data cannot be done yet.














Encourage the Ministry of Religion to issue **Ministerial Regulations** related to standardized zakat data information systems.
